TASK: Using what you have learned about stories over the past few weeks, you will write a short story of your own.

GUIDELINES:

- Your story must be a minimum of 1 page and a maximum of 4 pages.
 The assignment must be typed using size 12 font and double spaced (Next Week)
- Your story must have ONE main character
- Your main character must be Round and Dynamic (experience some kind of growth or change)
- Your story must have a minimum of ONE and a maximum of 3 supporting characters.
- Your story must have a PROTAGONIST and an ANTAGONIST
- Your story must have a clear theme. Some kind of moral lesson.
- Your story must clearly fit on a plot diagram, and follow the order of events of a linear narrative (plot).
- Your story must clearly include at least one type of conflict.
- Attach the rubric to your final copy and don't forget to choose a creative and appropriate title.

<u>Alternate option</u>: You may choose to create a graphic story as an alternative option. This option will be a combination of written and visual work. Students who choose this option will be required to create 5 drawings to illustrate each part of plot, and write out a shorter version of their story to explain what is happening


